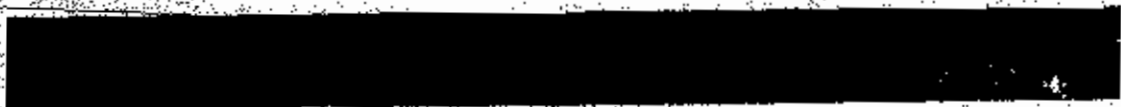

First, I order and direct that all my just debts and funeral expenses be duly paid and satisfied as soon as conveniently can be done after my decease.

Second, All the rest, residue and remainder of my estate, real, personal or mixed whatsoever the same may be or wheresoever situate which may belong to me or be owned by me at the time of my decease, I give devise and bequeath unto my two children, Caroline wife of John Burges and Margaret the wife of Arthur Gebartz, to them their heirs and assigns forever.

Lastly, I hereby nominate

constituted and appointed the above
named John Burgess & Arthur
Lebratz, Executors of this my last
Will & Testament.
