## News From Germany

Doug Eglen and Lynette Hazelbaker of Kentucky, have corresponded with a German genealogist who agreed, for a fee, to do some research on our Peter Hasselbacher. This was in 1984/85, the genealogist contacted was Reinhard Mayer. Some of the records researched were The Nurnberg Archives for church records and military records. A military book by a Erhard Stadler lists a Peter Hasselbacher as a deserter because he never returned to Germany. There are some old volumes of the old gazette of Ansbach Dukedom concerning the time 1781-1790 in the Ansbach Library. We think Peter went with the Ansbach-Bayreuth troops and not with the Hessian soldiers, as previously thought.

Reinhard Mayer contacted another genealogist who has worked on the Hasselbacher family tree, his result: All Hasselbacher families of Ansbach area originate from a Stefan Hasselbacher, living in 1608 in Gresten Parish (Austria). His son Wolfgang Hasselbacher emigrated, for reasons of his protestant creed, in 1666 to Unterschweinach (in Ansbach area). He died in 1674, he had two brothers Adam and Andreas who also emigrated to Ansbach area. Peter is the descendant of Wolfgang, Adam, or Andreas. The direct lineage of Wolfgang is as follows: Wolfgang's son is Paul, born in Dottenheim in 1672 Paul's son is Johann Paul born in Stubach in 1706 Johann P.'s son is Johann Adam born in Rehweiler in 1751. Johann A.'s daughter is Anna Maria born in Ansbach in 1787.

Lloyd Hazelbaker's daughter was in the Ansbach area recently and in the Ansbach phone book was listed one Hans Hasselbacher! So when the hostage problem in Europe settles down, let's go!

Thank you, Doug Eglen and Lynette Hazelbaker for sharing your info from the Motherland! The next issue of THE HAZELBAKER NEWS in Aug. 87 will have a German update, as I have written to Reinhard.



### OBITUARY FOR MRS. SARAH ALICE HARRIS

Sarah Alice Hazelbaker was born in Indianapolla, Indiana, on September 12, 1867. She departed from this life June 1, 1932, at the age of 64 years, 8 months and 20 days.

She came with her parents in a covered wagon to Aurora, Nebraska, in the year 1876, then moving to Custer county, Nebraska in 1883.

She was united in marriage to Alfred H. Harris of Lexington, Nebraska, in the year of 1885, later moving seven and one-half miles east of Lexington where they made their home. To this union four children were born, one having preceded her in death.

In the year of 1919 they came to Brighton, Colorado, where she has since resided.

She leaves to mourn her loss her husband and sons, John William and Clarence E., both of Brighton, and one daughter, Amy Mae Loveless, and four grandchildren, Lois, Irene and Dorothy Harris and Alvin Loveless, one sister of Estes Park, Colorado, and one brother of Wyoming, and a host of other relatives and friends.

She united with the Christian church of Lexington, Nebraska, in the year 1890 and after moving to Brighton she united with the Methodist church. She was a loving wife and mother, was loved by all who knew her and will be sadly missed.





John was born 1861, in Allamuchy, daughter of the above mentioned Shively and married Nancy. Here were born to him nine sons: Peter, John, William, George, David, Joseph, and John.
